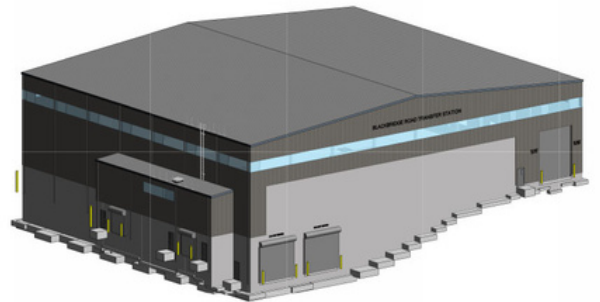

Blackbridge Road Transfer Station 🚚 Construction Has Begun!



Things are on the move here at YCSWA! The Blackbridge Road Transfer Station has turned the corner from rendering to actual dirt moving.

As we've mentioned in prior posts, the new transfer station will allow greater operational flexibility to efficiently manage incoming waste materials at the York County Resource Recovery Center. Upon completion of this new infrastructure, York County residents will be able to conveniently drop off their traditional household waste as well as construction and demolition waste, at a centralized location. It will also enable YCSWA to continue to accept municipal solid waste and approved residual waste streams in the event that the York County Resource Recovery Center reaches processing capacity. The Blackbridge Road Transfer Station will be conveniently located on the York County Resource Recovery Center campus.

Renewable Energy at HARC

Among the things you should check out at the Hopewell Area Recreation Complex (HARC) are the solar panels. These solar panels produce approximately 300,000 kilowatt hours (AC) of electricity annually which is approximately the annual energy usage at the complex which sits on top of a closed landfill. They are located near our Maintenance Building on Plank Rd.

It's unofficially summer! So, here is information on the top three summer items that we receive disposal questions about:

1. POOL CHEMICALS- Materials such as pool/spa chemicals can react strongly with other substances and may cause fires or explosions. Visit www.ycswa.com/services/waste-disposal/household-hazardous-waste/ for detailed instructions for disposal.

2. PROPANE TANKS- Pressurized propane tanks which contain flammable gases cannot be disposed of in your regular trash due to risk of explosion and fire. Information on disposal can be found at www.ycswa.com/gas-tanks/.

3. AIR CONDITIONER UNITS- Unwanted air conditioner units can be taken to a scrap metal business to be recycled. You can also contact your trash hauler to see if they will take it with your regular trash pick-up or bring it to our Small Load Drop-Off area located at the York County Resource Recovery Center (YCRRC). It Is **Unsafe** To Put RECHARGEABLE BATTERIES In Your Trash Or Recycling Bin!



Just a Reminder that Rechargeable Batteries DO NOT Go in Your Curbside Trash or Recycling Bin!

Rechargeable batteries are in many of the things we use today. While these batteries are very convenient to use, they are a fire hazard when compacted in a trash truck or compressed in the waste storage pit. Never put rechargeable batteries in your regular trash or recycling bin!

NOTE: Household alkaline batteries like Eveready, Duracell (AA, AAA, 9-volt, C, or D sizes) can be disposed of in your regular trash.
