Your trash hauler brings your garbage to the York County Resource Recovery Center where it is turned into electricity. Don't know who your trash hauler is? Contact your municipal office to find out who picks up trash in your neighborhood.



Winter is here! In order to prepare for trash collection in inclement weather, below are several reminders from our friends at Penn Waste to help ensure that your trash will be picked up safely:

Trash Bags — Use dark colored trash bags so the hauler is able to more easily spot the garbage which needs to be collected.

Access to Your Trash & Recycling — Please make sure there is a clear, safe path to access your trash and recycling bags or bins.

Be Patient — Trash and recycling may not be collected at the exact time or on the same day that it is usually gotten due to poor weather conditions.

 $Children - Ask\ your\ children\ to\ play\ away\ from\ the\ streets\ as\ visibility\ may\ be\ impaired\ due\ to\ weather\ conditions.$

Slow Down Before You Go Around —Make sure you slow down before you go around after checking for on-coming traffic and trash collectors who may be at the side of the truck.

Keep Your Eyes On the Road When Driving — Keep your eyes on the road at all times and give yourself some room between other vehicles when driving.

Board Member Information



The tip fee (cost for disposal) for York County processible municipal solid waste at the York County Resource Recovery Center (RRC) for 2023 will increase from \$70.00 per ton to \$72 per ton. This increase represents a 2.8 percent increase. The minimum fee to dispose of waste will be \$20 for up to 540 pounds.

The tip fee does not include collection costs charged by waste hauling companies hired to provide trash removal services. In most cases waste hauling companies charge customers a fee that covers the Authority's tipping fee, as well as costs for waste collection, hauling and curbside recycling.
