

Unusable Stringed Lights Should Go In The Trash!

Do you have an abundance of holiday lights that are burned out and unusable? If so, you can SIMPLY PUT THEM IN YOUR REGULAR TRASH. Stringed lights in a recycling bin will cause a problem at the recycling facility and are potentially hazardous to those working in the facility as they become wrapped around equipment and need to be manually cut off.

Unusable lights and any other garbage placed in your regular trash will be used as fuel to create electricity when it is brought to the York County Resource Recover Center by your hauler. Your old holiday lights used to create electricity, who knew? Waste-to-Energy: working for York County.



The York County Solid Waste Authority has approved its budget for fiscal 2026, including a tipping fee increase to address rising costs and to fund projects for long term system stability. The tip fee for York County processible municipal solid waste at the York County Resource Recovery Center (YCRRC) for 2026 will increase to \$85 per ton in response to fiscal pressures created by rising operational costs and the Authority's obligation to prepare for the future and ensure York County's waste is properly managed with sustained environmental protection. With uncertainty over future local landfill capacity, the Authority must prepare now to meet the future waste management needs for York County.

- -Computers
- -Computer Monitors
- -Computer Peripherals (Keyboard, Mouse, Printer, etc.)
- -Televisions


Electronics Recycling
